## Celebrating 40 Years of Service and Culture



HSS SLOUGH CELEBRATES VIJAYADASHAMI



The HSS Slough celebrated its 40th anniversary with a grand Vijaya Dashami celebration at Langley College, Slough on Saturday, 4th October.

The event brought together more than 325 attendees, including community leaders, members, youth volunteers, and local dignitaries, honouring four decades of community service, cultural enrichment, and unity across Slough and Maidenhead.

For forty years, from 1985, the Slough branch has connected generations through shared values of service, discipline, and togetherness, nurturing leadership and cultural confidence among young people while contributing positively to British society.



The celebration began with a colourful cultural performance, featuring a melodious group song and a thought-provoking skit titled "9 Colours of Victory". The performance explored the deeper meaning of Vijaya Dashami — symbolising the triumph of good over evil through courage, compassion, and righteousness. Attendees also witnessed demonstrations of traditional physical activities that form part of the branch's regular sessions, including Suryanamaskar (a series of yogic sun salutations promoting health and mindfulness), Samata (team coordination and discipline through rhythmic movements), and Dand, an ancient Indian martial art symbolising focus and self-control.



A special exhibition showcased the 40-year journey of the Slough branch - captured moments from decades of community service, social initiatives, and cultural programmes, showcasing how HSS(UK) has positively contributed to the local community over the years.

The event welcomed several distinguished guests and representatives from more than 15 organisations, including Slough Borough Council, Slough Hindu Mandir, Kho Kho Federation UK, Frimley Health NHS Foundation Trust, Royal Berkshire Fire & Rescue, and Thames Valley Police, among others.



The Mayor of Slough, Councillor Siobhan Dauti, in her remarks, said: "For four decades, the Slough branch of HSS has been a wellspring of inspiration—serving our community wholeheartedly and empowering young people to embrace their culture and leadership. The legacy of community service and cultural enrichment shown here reflects what we can achieve when we stand together."



The keynote speaker from HSS UK, Shri Ram Ji Vaidya, praised the contribution of Hindus in the UK, noting: "If the UK is milk, Hindus are the sugar — we dissolve and enrich society. Hindus are not just residents; we are contributors who bring light, culture, and care wherever we live."



KNS was held in Leamington on 27th Sep, with a sankhya of 97 including Adhikaris. It was jointly planned and executed by Coventry and Leamington nagars. The whole atmosphere was filled with energy, learning, and a sense of commitment. For most of us it was an opportunity to meet and connect with many SS/Sevikas from other Nagars -Birmingham, Coventry, Leamington, Stoke on Trent, Stratford, and Sutton Coldfield.

Through Bauddhiks by Ram Ji and Tushar Ji, we learned a wide range of new things - from understanding the role and qualities of a karyakarta, reflecting living our life with a purpose, importance of communication and influencing, and understanding of societal view. The sessions were split for Yuva/ti and Kishor/i + Tarun/i. Creative and interactive methods used made the sessions especially engaging.

Khel sessions were spread to keep our body and mind fit. We played different versions of kabaddi and multiple new khels which could be implemented into regular shakhas. These included not only physical activities but also mental challenges, such as creating shapes with eyes closed as a team or building Lego without instructions. These games encouraged creative thinking, teamwork, and helped reenergise us.

Another highlight was the Darshana exhibition set up, where we explored details of Hindu culture and civilization and interacted with friends and guests.

The focussed efforts from Karyakartas made the Sammelan both - educational and enjoyable.
